COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " " to H.P. 376, L.D. 519, Bill, "An Act To Expand Adult Dental Health Insurance Coverage"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

**'Resolve, To Direct the Bureau of Insurance To Review and Evaluate the Expansion of Adult Dental Health Insurance Coverage'**

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

**'Sec. 1. Review pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24-A, section 2752. Resolved:** That the Superintendent of Insurance shall pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24-A, section 2752 conduct a review and evaluation of proposed legislation submitted during the 129th Legislature to expand adult dental health insurance coverage.

**Sec. 2. Report. Resolved:** That, no later than <sup>March</sup> ~~February~~ 1, 2021, the Superintendent of Insurance shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health coverage, insurance and financial services matters with the results of the review and evaluation required in section 1.

**Sec. 3. Legislation. Resolved:** That the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health coverage, insurance and financial services matters may report out a bill to the First Regular Session of the 130th Legislature based on the report provided in accordance with section 2.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill and is the majority report of the committee. The amendment turns the bill into a resolve and changes the title. The amendment directs the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance to conduct pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24-A, section 2752 a review and evaluation

1 of the expansion of adult dental health insurance coverage and submit a report to the joint  
2 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health coverage, insurance  
3 and financial services matters no later than ~~February~~ 1, 2021. The joint standing  
4 committee is authorized to report out a bill based on the report to the First Regular  
5 Session of the 130th Legislature.

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill requires the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance, to review and evaluate the expansion of adult dental insurance coverage. The department has indicated it will require, and the bill includes in fiscal year 2020-21 only, an allocation of \$12,500 to contract out for this review. This allocation will be funded by existing resources within the Bureau of Insurance.
