Successes: 2015-2019

Throughout the last five years, MaineHousing has helped thousands of Mainers buy, rent, heat, and repair their homes. Our last five years of funding and services successes include:

- Nearly 5,150 first-time homebuyers became homeowners through our First Home Loan program.
- Over 13,640 Mainers attended homebuyer education classes.
- Over 2,500 families and older Mainers now call 60 completed affordable housing projects home.
- Over 1,880 homes have been weatherized.
- An average of 32,216 households each year received heating assistance through our Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP).

- Nearly 450 houses were remediated of lead.
- Nearly 700 homes were repaired.
- An average of 3,732 people each year received a Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher.
- Over 230 people participated in our ReStart family self-sufficiency program.
- Our single-family loan delinquency rate has dropped to 2.46%.
- Over 45 landlords and property management companies are part of our Owner Excellence Program.
