As chairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business, we write to convey to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs the recommendations of the Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business Committee regarding items within its jurisdiction in the proposed supplemental budget, LD 42.

Please find attached the report forms with initiatives applicable to the IDEA Committee.

The committee voted "In" all initiatives with the following two exceptions:

- 1. Ref. # 164: This initiative reduces funding to the Maine Technology Institute by the Department of Economic and Community Development in the amount of \$336,515, via curtailment. Three committee members voted against the reduction. These members felt that reductions in funding for innovation were inappropriate at a time when the State should be encouraging such enterprises.
- 2. Ref. # 220: This initiative reduces funding provided through the Finance Authority of Maine to the Maine Venture Fund to invest in Maine companies in the amount of \$50,000, via curtailment. Nine committee members voted against the reduction. These members felt that the State should not be making reductions in business investment at a time when many businesses are struggling due to the COVID pandemic.

Thank you for your consideration of the recommendations of the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business.
