The Judiciary Committee is pleased to present its recommendations concerning the Maine Human Rights Commission, the Department of the Attorney General, the Judicial Branch and the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services contained in the Supplemental Budget, LD 42, An Act Making Certain Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government.

The Judiciary Committee met remotely on Thursday, February 4, 2021 and voted unanimously to support the Governor's proposals, plus unanimously voted to support the immediate addition of two crucial positions as part of the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services. These are the positions supported by the 129th Judiciary Committee: an attorney who will focus on training and quality control, and a nonattorney position to provide the necessary audit function. We support the inclusion of these positions in the upcoming Biennial Budget as well. The worksheets, Part S and the new positions and funding information (for three months) are attached.
