PART III

Sec. III-1. Transfer to the Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife, Office of the Commissioner – IF&W. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2021, the State Controller shall transfer \$4,084,500 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife, Office of the Commissioner – IF&W, Other Special Revenue Fund account for the purpose of the funding unmet capital construction and repair needs for state dams.

PART III SUMMARY

This Part transfers \$4,084,500 to the Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife, Office of the Commissioner – IF&W to provide funding unmet capital construction and repair needs for several state-owned dams
