Re: Report back on the Governor's Change Package to LD 221

The Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs met to review the budget items pertaining to agencies under our jurisdiction in the Governor's Change Package to LD 221 on Monday, May 24, 2021.

Attached, please find a print out of the relevant initiatives and language parts with notations indicating the committee's majority and minority positions. In addition to the print outs, please find below a summary of the initiatives and recommended amendments that require further information and explanation, as well as a description of a new initiative that the committee recommends the Appropriations and Financial Affairs Committee consider during your deliberations.

Department of Education

Leadership Team Z077

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The majority of the committee voted to recommended approval of the revised initiative to provide funding for the reorganization of the Public Service Executive position to a Chief Innovation Officer position. The minority of the committee voted to recommend approval of neither the current nor the revised initiative and recommended that funding be provided neither for the reorganization of the Public Service Manger II position to a Chief of Operations position

nor for the reorganization of the Public Service Executive position to a Chief Innovation Officer position.

National Board Certification Salary Supplemental Fund Z147

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This initiative provides one-time funding to support retrospective and prospective payments for teachers with national board certification.

The majority of the committee voted to recommend approval of the initiative for both retroactive and prospective salary supplements. The minority voted to recommend approval of the prospective salary supplements but disapproval of retroactive salary supplements.
