Recommendations on Governor's change package to LD 221

On May 25, 2021, the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities and Technology reviewed a number of proposed budget items in the Governor's change package to LD 221. The committee's recommendations on those items are described below.

## Governor's Energy Office

With respect to the initiatives described on page 61 of the Part A initiatives (Governor's Energy Office), 4 members voted to recommend acceptance of these initiatives and 4 members voted to reject these initiatives. Five members were absent at the time of the vote (Carlow, Foster, Grignon, Stewart and Zeigler).

Of those 4 members voting to reject these initiatives, one (Wadsworth) specified that it was due to the General Fund allocations and three members (Berry, Grohoski and Kessler) specified that they wanted more information from the Governor's Energy Office and may provide the AFA Committee with additional input at a later date.

#### **Public Utilities Commission**

With respect to the initiatives described on pages 186 and 187 of the Part A initiatives and Language Part UUU on pages 56 and 57 (Public Utilities Commission), 8 members voted to recommend acceptance of these initiatives and Language Part. Five members were absent at the time of the vote (Carlow, Foster, Grignon, Stewart and Zeigler).

Sec. UUU-1. 2 MRSA §6-A, sub-§3, as amended by PL 2015, c. 8, §1, is further amended to read:

- 3. Other employees. The salaries of the following employees are within salary range 53:
- A. General counsel;
- B. Director of telephone and water utility industries;
- C. Administrative Director;
- D. Director of electric and gas utility industries; and
- E. Director of consumer assistance and safety; and
- F. Director of emergency services communication.

Sec. UUU-2. 5 MRSA §949, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2015, c. 8, §2, is further amended to read:

- 1. Major policy-influencing positions. The following positions are major policy-influencing positions within the Public Utilities Commission. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, these positions and their successor positions shall-be are subject to this chapter:
- A. General Counsel Public Utilities Commission;
- B. Director of telephone and water utility industries;
- C. Administrative Director;
- D. Director of electric and gas utility industries; and
- E. Director of consumer assistance and safety; and
- F. Director of emergency services communication.

This Part reclassifies the Public Utilities Commission's director of emergency services communication to be consistent with other commission directors.
