Statement of Fact

This financial order provides funding for contracts to enhance Maine's response to address the health and social needs of our aging and disabled population. Funding will be provided to Maine Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) who will expand outreach of Home-Delivered Nutrition Services, Adult Day programs, legal assistance services, Money Minders services, and transportation services. The expansion of these services will allow for elders to remain independent. Funding will also be provided to the Maine Long Term Care Ombudsman to promote policies and practices needed to improve the quality of care and life in long-term care facilities and educate both consumers and providers about residents' rights and good care practices. Funding will also be provided to the Elder Abuse Institute of Maine to support statewide Support Navigator Services, a Direct Purchased Services Pilot program, and data analysis and reporting to find improvement opportunities for the Adult Protective Services programs. Funding is provided by multiple grants authorized by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

Statement of Fact

This financial order provides funding to address public health disparities by ensuring greater equity and access to COVID-19 vaccine for those disproportionately affected by COVID-19 in Maine. This funding will be used to target populations that are considered high-risk and underserved, including racial and ethnic minority groups, people living in communities with a high social vulnerability index and people in rural areas. The adult vaccination program will be expanded to provide outreach and information to persons with disabilities, especially members of the deaf and hard of hearing community, provide outreach and education to direct care staff in Maine long term care facilities around the state, to ensure homebound individuals can receive vaccinations in their homes, and to offer education and vaccine support for COVID-19 boosters and flu vaccines. Funds will also be used to provide stipends to Intellectual and Developmental Disability clinics, to provide transportation to COVID-19 vaccination sites, and to allow staff who are working on COVID-19 activities to charge their time and position related costs to this grant. Funding is authorized by the American Rescue Plan Act.

The University of Maine System has incurred substantial unbudgeted costs related to COVID-19 and this financial order will cover costs related to personal protective equipment including but not limited to masks, face shields, hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes purchased for each campus, COVID-19 testing of students and employees, testing the wastewater on campuses to monitor public health conditions and quarantining students including delivered food services and isolation rooms in hotels and residence halls. The allotment requested in quarter 1 is for reimbursement requests sent in April 2021 and September 2021 for costs incurred through February 2021 and allotment in quarter 2 is for the remaining funding approved for these purposes.
