The Marine Resources Committee has reviewed and discussed those portions of the Governor's proposed Supplemental Budget Bill (LD 1995) that are under the committee's jurisdiction.

The committee voted unanimously to move <u>IN</u> all budget initiatives. The vote on each initiative is indicated on the attached supplemental budget work sheet.

The committee also voted unanimously to move <u>IN</u> the following budget initiatives anticipated to be part of the Governor's Change Package:

- Bureau of Policy and Management, Department of Marine Resources Legal Defense General Fund allocation increase from \$980,000 to \$1,000,000 in FY 2021-22 and increased from \$0 to \$2,000,000 in FY 2022-23.
- Bureau of Marine Science, Department of Marine Resources one employee initiative reclassification from Marine Resource Scientist II to Marine Resource Scientist III
- Bureau of Public Health, Department of Marine Resources three employee initiative reclassifications from Laboratory Tech III to Microbiologist II
