#### Justification:

Space issues at the Maine State Library have been well documented in architectural studies over the last 20 years. Over the library's 185 years in service to the people of Maine, it has established several permanent collections pertaining to the history and culture of Maine that have steadily grown. As the library prepares to move back to space at the Cultural Building, a new shelving layout is planned for the public area of the library to ensure compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq. (1990) in the aisles between shelves. The new layout will also provide additional space for conducting research, group meetings and public events. This funding will purchase high density compact shelving for the first floor storehouse of the library to relieve current space constraints and accommodate materials that no longer will have room in the public stacks of the library. The basis for this request is documented in a 2019 study commissioned by the Bureau of General Services (Storage Space Requirements Summary - Final; Space Planning for Cultural Building & BABLO Building), which recommended installation of high density mobile shelving on the first floor of the library with the goal of nearly doubling the storage capacity of that space.
