An Act To Allow All Veterans To Be Eligible for In-state Tuition Rates

(AFTER DEADLINE)

(EMERGENCY)

- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- Whereas, this legislation provides greater affordability to veterans for attendance at
 Maine's postsecondary educational institutions; and
- 5 **Whereas,** veterans may need to make their decisions about which postsecondary 6 educational institution to attend prior to the end of the 90-day period; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
therefore,

11 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §10010, as amended by PL 2013, c. 311, §2, is further 13 amended to read:

14 **§10010. Veterans**

15 Regardless of the state of residence, a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States who is enrolled in an undergraduate program of education at any campus of the 16 University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System or the Maine 17 18 Maritime Academy is eligible for in-state tuition rates. If the veteran is using the benefits under the Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2008, that veteran must 19 receive a waiver from the tuition that remains after the application of all payments from 20 21 the federal Department of Veterans Affairs, including payments under the Yellow Ribbon 22 G.I. Education Enhancement Program in the Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance 23 Act of 2008, and the application of other nonrepayable resources for which the veteran 24 may be eligible. The amount of the tuition waiver received by a veteran under this 25 section may not exceed an amount that lowers the tuition to less than the in-state tuition 26 charged by the institution. This section applies to all veterans enrolled at any campus of 27 the University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System or Maine Maritime Academy in an undergraduate program of education. A nonresident student 28 29 entitled to a waiver under this section must be considered eligible for in-state tuition.

- 30 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
 31 legislation takes effect when approved.
- 32 SUMMARY

Current law allows veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States who use socalled G.I. Bill benefits for tuition at any campus of the University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System or the Maine Maritime Academy to be eligible for instate tuition rates, regardless of their state of residency. This bill extends that eligibility for in-state tuition rates to all veterans, regardless of their state of residency and regardless of whether they use G.I. Bill benefits to pay tuition.
