16 17 18 19	4. Wild mushroom. "Wild mushroom" means a mushroom that is harvested for commercial purposes in the wild. "Wild mushroom" does not include a cultivated mushroom that is grown, harvested, processed and packaged by a commercial organization.

Any officer authorized to make inspections, investigations or arrests under this Article may seize and hold Christmas trees of, evergreen boughs <u>or wild mushrooms</u> until proof of ownership has been established. If no proof of ownership has been established, the officer shall try to determine where those trees of, boughs <u>or wild mushrooms</u> were cut <u>or harvested</u> and notify the landowner. If the owner does not want the trees of, boughs <u>or wild mushrooms</u>, or ownership cannot be determined, the State may dispose of them and any money derived from the disposition of the trees and, boughs shall <u>or wild mushrooms must</u> be paid to the landowner, if <u>his</u> <u>the landowner's</u> identity can be established and, otherwise, to the Treasurer of State to be credited to the General Fund.

Sec. 5. 12 MRSA §8847, as repealed and replaced by PL 1983, c. 507, §4, is amended to read:

§8847. Enforcement agencies

State police, county sheriffs, municipal law enforcement officers, state forest rangers and game wardens are authorized to make <u>inpsections</u> <u>inspections</u>, investigations, arrests and disposals of trees <u>and</u>, boughs <u>or wild mushrooms</u> under this Article.'

Amend the bill in section 7 in the 4th and 5th lines (page 3, lines 31 and 32 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "boughs, wild mushrooms and fiddleheads" and inserting the following: 'boughs and wild mushrooms'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

30 SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report. It removes fiddleheads from the title of the bill. The amendment deletes from the bill prohibitions against commercially harvesting fiddleheads without written permission or a bill of sale from the landowner. The amendment also deletes from the bill the definition of "fiddlehead."
