RABBI ASCH: This week, in the Jewish tradition, we read the beginning of the dramatic story of the Israelites' escape from slavery in Egypt. The biblical text tells about how Moses and his brother, Aaron, go to the leader of the Egyptians, who is simply called Pharaoh, and asks that the Israelite people be allowed to leave Egypt, but Pharaoh will not listen. God sends ten plagues, each more terrible than the last, but, again and again, we read that Pharaoh hardened his heart. Even when miracles appeared before him, Pharaoh was unable to see the error of his ways. He is the epitome of one whose heart is closed and who is unable to change.

Many years later we meet a prophet named Jonah who calls to the people of Ninevah to repent. We read that the King of Ninevah immediately takes off his robe and sits in sackcloth and ashes, a sign of mourning for all his wrongdoing. He orders his people to repent of their wicked ways and to ask forgiveness, and it works. God sees that the people truly repent and the city is saved. In a collection of midrashim, which are stories that are written later by the rabbis to shed light on the biblical text, we find a surprising statement. The rabbis connect these two stories. They tell us that the King of Ninevah is none other than Pharaoh. They say that the story teaches us that even Pharaoh, who seemed so unrepentant, is able to change.

Let us pray. Eloheinu v'lohei avoteinu v'imotainu, our God and God of our ancestors, may we recognize in ourselves our own tendency to harden our hearts towards others and to become stuck in our way of thinking and of doing things. At a time when our differences are emphasized, may we instead open our hearts to our similarities. May we recognize the divine spark in all whom we meet, especially those with whom we do not agree. Let us seek to see the good in those with whom we work, and be ever mindful of our own capacity for change. This day, and always, may our hearts not be hardened, but be opened. Amen.

**JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING
NOVEMBER 13, 2016 AS PANCREATIC CANCER
AWARENESS DAY**

WHEREAS, researchers estimate that about 48,960 people in the United States will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer and about 40,560 will die from the disease this year, approximately 210 of whom live in Maine; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the few cancers for which the survival rates have had little improvement in nearly 40 years, with 73% of patients with pancreatic cancer dying within one year of their diagnosis and 93% dying within 5 years of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the 4th-leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States, with no early detection test to diagnose the disease in its early stages when surgical removal of the tumor is still possible; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer occurs when abnormal cell growth begins in the pancreas, with family history, smoking, age and diabetes being major risk factors; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer may cause vague symptoms that could indicate many different conditions, including abdominal or back pain, weight loss, jaundice, loss of appetite and nausea; and

WHEREAS, surgical removal, the best possible treatment option, is available for fewer than 20% of patients diagnosed and chemotherapy or radiation is typically offered to patients whose tumors cannot be removed surgically; and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of Maine are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness of pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes and effective treatments; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-seventh Legislature now assembled in the Second Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, recognize that November 13, 2016 is Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Day in order to make our citizens more aware of this prevalent disease; and be it further

RESOLVED: That 4 suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network.
