**JOINT RESOLUTION
URGING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO
REPEAL AND REPLACE OUTDATED AUTHORIZATIONS
OF MILITARY FORCE**

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Special Session, most respectfully present and petition the Congress of the United States, as follows:

WHEREAS, nearly 2 decades after the attack on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon, United States troops continue to wage war in Iraq, Afghanistan and other parts of the world; and

WHEREAS, our service members accomplished their original objectives in Afghanistan long ago, at great psychological, physical and spiritual cost; and

WHEREAS, the war on terrorism, the "forever war" or "endless war" as many call it, has been used as the basis for an ever-expanding range of military actions; and

WHEREAS, James Madison wrote to Thomas Jefferson in 1798, "The constitution supposes, what the History of all Governments demonstrates that the Executive is the branch of power most interested in war . . . It has accordingly with studied care, vested the question of war in the Legislature"; and

WHEREAS, Congress has mostly abdicated its Article I responsibilities to authorize and oversee military actions by extensive, potentially permanent delegations of congressional war powers; and

WHEREAS, the Authorization for Use of Military Force passed after the September 11 attacks has now been in effect for more than twice as long as the 1964-1971 Gulf of Tonkin Resolution, which gave President Lyndon B. Johnson authorization, without a formal declaration of war by Congress, for the use of conventional military force in Southeast Asia; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Defense's 2018 National Defense Strategy outlines a scenario where great power competition, rather than counterterrorism, drives the department's decision making and use of force; and

WHEREAS, a growing number of foreign policy officials have begun to advocate for a drawdown in the Middle East and Central Asia because of the opportunity costs to America's mission of balancing its strength against the so-called revisionist powers of China and Russia; and

WHEREAS, the emphasis on bolstering a deterrent posture in Asia and Europe should have an attendant impact that reduces the United States military's activities in the Middle East, Africa and the Western Hemisphere; and

WHEREAS, the United States and the Republic of China (Taiwan) share a vibrant bilateral relationship marked by a mutually beneficial partnership, supported by our common values of freedom, democracy, rule of law and a free market economy, and our countries now enjoy the strongest relations ever; and

WHEREAS, President Tsai Ing-wen has worked tirelessly to ensure the prosperity of Taiwan's 23.5 million people and promote international standing and has expressed commitment to peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of State, Department of Commerce and Department of Agriculture clarified United States policy regarding Taiwan in a formal letter sent to governors of all 50 states dated November 21, 2019 stating that "expanding relations with Taiwan in areas such as trade, education, investment, and tourism is fully compatible with and supports U.S. policy and can be beneficial to your state or municipality"; and

WHEREAS, President Tsai has expressed Taiwan's desire to reach a bilateral trade agreement with the United States, and the 116th United States Congress's Public Law 116-135, "Taiwan Allies International Protection and Enhancement Initiative (TAIPEI) Act of 2019," affirms that the United States should engage in strengthening bilateral trade and economic relations with Taiwan; and

WHEREAS, New England exported more than \$1 billion in goods to Taiwan in 2020, of which Maine exported \$52 million in goods, mostly in computer and electronic products, fish and other marine products, machinery and chemicals, making Taiwan Maine's 12th largest export market in the world and the 7th largest export market in Asia in 2019, and Taiwan and the United States seek to increase trade and investment through a bilateral trade agreement, resulting in even greater Maine exports to Taiwan, educational and cultural exchange, scientific and technological interests and tourism; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan is a key transport hub in the Asia-Pacific region, making its inclusion in international organizations such as the World Health Organization, the International Criminal Police Organization and the International Civil Aviation Organization

Senator **GUERIN:** Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, in the 129th Legislature the Labor Committee unanimously voted to remove the sub-minimum wage which was used as an incentive for hiring handicap employees. At the work session, I stated that I would be interested in putting in a tax credit for businesses who employed handicap individuals and many people on the committee said, on both sides of the aisle, said that they would like to co-sponsor that. The advocacy groups all said that would be a wonderful addition and substitution where the employee would be able to have full pay and self-esteem from that, but the business who perhaps would have to have another employee closely supervise or help the handicap worker, it would be an incentive for the business to hire those

workers. I know I had had a constituent approach me about the need for some kind of subsidy for her autistic son, who was unable to find a job because he had to be supervised, one-on-one supervision, but that he was able and interested in working but wasn't able to find an employer who was willing to hire him at full compensation. So, I put in this bill and I will admit I didn't do a good job during the COVID lock-down in getting my co-sponsors. I should have approached the people from the 129th Labor Committee and asked them to co-sponsor that. So perhaps it was looked at as a partisan issue, but in the 129th it had wide support to have this tax breaks for businesses employing people with disabilities. So, I would urge you to vote against the pending motion. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Chipman.

Senator **CHIPMAN:** Thank you, Mr. President. In Maine, we should not treat people differently. We should treat everybody the same. With this bill, and the way this conversation happened in committee, it really felt like those who were disabled are not, at least the conversation was kind of getting around to the idea, it seemed like those that are disabled are somehow not worth as much as people who are not disabled and that didn't feel right to many of us on the committee and we didn't feel like we, you know, should be having to offer a tax credit to businesses that hire someone who is disabled when they should hire them anyways to work and we did not hear a lot of people saying that they aren't able to find work right now who have a disability but have to offer an incentive just feels like, you know, somehow they're not worth as much, you've got to give an incentive for them to hire them, and it just doesn't feel right and so I hope you'll stick with me and vote Ought Not to Pass on this. Thank you.

Senator **TIMBERLAKE:** We just had a discussion in our caucus this morning, trying to figure out exactly what the amendment did. Is there somebody that could explain exactly what this amendment does, please?

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Chipman.

Senator **CHIPMAN:** So, the bill as amended in committee, I believe, was going to disqualify landowners from the Tree Growth Tax Program if they are aware of and facilitate the transportation of products within the United States from point to point. This would be truckers and contractors that come here from Canada. They come into Maine over the border and transport products and then drop things off point-to-point within the country, which is illegal under federal law but we heard a lot of testimony, and saw a video, that it's actually happening in Maine and there isn't anything being done about it, and so this is our attempt, at the state level, to do something to address that, to protect Maine jobs and the north woods and from those truckers that need employment up north. The amendment takes away all the Tree Growth punishment and basically just imposes a civil infraction, a civil violation, for transport of forest products by non-residents to prohibit transportation of certain forest products from a location in Maine to another location in Maine, and I believe it's after three violations that they would have a civil penalty, a fine basically.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Daughtry.

Senator **DAUGHTRY:** Thank you, Mr. President. I just rise to also answer the question and echo a lot of what the good Senator from Cumberland said and emphasize that this amendment works to protect Maine workers, to make sure that we are doing everything we can to protect a vital Maine industry, as well as those employed by it. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Timberlake.

Senator **TIMBERLAKE:** Mr. President, the only question I still have on this, as a landowner that might be in this situation, a lot of times the landowner might just call up a trucking company to do his trucking and he doesn't know who the trucking company hires or whatever. So, I ask that: is it the landowner that's going to be penalized or the trucking company that's doing the trucking? That's the part I'm trying to get clarity on because, you know, if I called up Joe Blow and he sends a trucker, and I don't have a clue whether he's out of state or in the state. I don't want to be penalized because I subcontract out trucking. There's an awful lot of that is done in the wood industry.

THE PRESIDENT: Senator, was that a question through the Chair to anyone that could answer?

Senator **TIMBERLAKE:** Yes, please. That's a question through the Chair. Sorry about that, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair would answer that, as the amendment reads, the Tree Growth provision has been removed, the violation on the Tree Growth provision, and there is two penalties. One for the trucking company that uses the H2 driver for a point-to-point hauling in Maine and there's a subsequent violation for the landowner over 50,000 acres that uses the trucking company that has the H2 driver that is violating the federal law, which would now be a State law too, because they are service contracts. THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Baldacci.

Senator **BALDACCI:** Thank you, Mr. President. We spent significant time in the State and Local Government Committee debating these. It was a civil debate. It was a fact-filled debate. But ultimately, in terms of how the majority came down is that we have a Governor who has successfully led us through this emergency, but this emergency is not done and we really think that trying to hamstring the Governor's Office is actually not in the best interest of either public health or the state of Maine. So, I would move Ought Not to Pass on this item. Thank you.

On motion by Senator **TIMBERLAKE** of Androscoggin, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Stewart.

Senator **STEWART:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I rise today to speak in opposition to the pending motion. This is my bill that I sponsored earlier in this session. You can tell from the title what it seeks to do. It's pretty simple. Any State of Emergency lasting longer than sixty days would require an affirmative vote from the Legislative Branch of government rather the unilateral control which we've experienced in the last almost year and a half. So, you heard some comments earlier about the fact that there is some recognition about the current Governor, the current Governor's handling of this current emergency. Well that's fine but what this bill would is apply to any Governor going forward in any state of civil emergency because, as we all know, the pendulum can swing and when it does you may not agree with the person who is now going to be making all these decisions with the precedence that has been set and without any sort of restraint put on that power whatsoever. You know, again, you've heard me talk about the fact that elections do have consequences and we're living under that right now. Some may agree with the way that the current Chief Executive is managing the crisis. Others may not and the point is the Legislative Branch is the branch of government that's closest to the people. It's the one that is elected by your neighbors. It's the one that sends your neighbors to the State House, in fact, to go be your voice in state government and represent your best interests in, well not the Civic Center but the Capitol Dome.

I'll say, too, that there have been very significant impacts of what's going on in the last year or so and, in fact, many businesses have been permanently closed without a single vote by the branch of government that is closest to those people and to those businesses. Businesses like: 3D Games, Andrews

Brewing Company, Anytime Fitness, Arabica's Crema, Bed Bath and Beyond, Belgrade Lakes Yoga, Benchwarmer Sports Pub, Bill's Pizza, Bindliff's, Blast from the Past Dinner, Blue Hill Café and Catering, Bonanza Steak House, Bucks Naked BBQ, Bucksport Bay Area Chamber of Commerce, Bull Moose Music, C&C O'Leary Tattoo Company, Café Soproso, Cellar Door Winery, Chester Pike's Gallery, China Dine-ah, Cinemagic, Denny's, Drifter's Wife, Eric's Restaurant and Catering, Ernie's Pool and Darts, Farm and Coast Café, Five Fifty-Five, Folster's Barber Shop, Flood's, Frostie's, Five Guys, Jerry's Used Cars, Get Fired Up, Gleason Media, Gorman Yoga Company, Grit and Grace Crossfit, Great Scot's Diner, Guitt's Dinner, Hair by Olivia, Heritage Printing, Holy Donut, Huiskamer Coffee Shop, Jester's and City Side Restaurant, Johnny's, John Scully's Vechi Ryu Karate Academy, Joseph's Fireside Steak House, Joker's, J.P. Market and Deli, Just Down the Road Grill, Kennebec Chocolates, L.B. Kitchen, Leo Restaurant, Liquid Sunshine, Logical Sip Café and Coffee, Maine Indoor Carting, Maine Made and More, Maine Street Sweets, Mantra Maine Massage and Yoga, Michael Mercer Consulting LLC, Midcoast Athletic Center, Newport House of Pizza, Nicky's Cruisin Diner, Nubble Books, Nuts and Bolts Brewing, On the Marsh Bistro, Old Port Sandwich Shop, Oriental Garden, Pastaz Italian Cuisine, Pat's Pizza, Peari Ultra Night Club and Tap House, Pedro O'Hara's, Piccolo, Pierrette's, C'est Si Bon Café - that's testing my French, Port City Music Hall, Pro Rental, Po' Boys and Pickles, Rockland Market Place, Royale Lunch Bar, Ruby Tuesdays - I happen to know there are four of them that have closed, Sherman's Maine Coast, Smitty's Cinema, Soul Sisters and Company, Soup for You Café, Sunrise Restaurant and Bakery, Boat Launch Pub of Standish, Starlight Café, Sip of Europe, Tagley, Tasman Leather, The Century Theater, The Cider House, The Drouthy Bear, The House of Lights, The Paper Patch, The Play Factory, The Warehouse Bar and Grill, Tilted Kilt, Timeless Cottage, Tula Health Club, Uncle Ernie's Dinner, Union Street Billiards, Vineland, Woodhaul, Whitecraft, Wild Burritos, Wyler's. There's a number of other businesses. This list goes on and on, the businesses that have either - those were the businesses that have permanently closed down. There's even more that have temporarily closed down and their employees have been left without any recourse at all and they expect this Body, and the people that they send, the people that they know, and who said that they would stand up for them, to take action. This is a really common-sense way to do that. In fact, there's even a precedence set for that in our Maine Statutes and other areas of Maine law where we curtail emergency powers because we don't want any one branch having undue influence and overpower over another one. That's a foundational principle that our government was founded on and that's one that we should continue to support here today by rejecting this motion and supporting this bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Baldacci.

Senator **BALDACCI:** First I want to start that I completely respect the concerns that the Senator from Aroostook has expressed. I grew up and worked in a family small business for ten years. I run a small business. I have to meet a payroll. I've had to deal with the dislocations because, in fact, the court system doesn't work the way it used to work at all. But it was a pandemic and I think that when the Senator from Aroostook or the proponents of

this bill try to tell us it's not directed at the current Chief Executive and then give a litany of things that they feel can be left at her doorstep than I feel that that is somewhat not in keeping with what they had said. There was a pandemic. There are 600,000 Americans that have died. We have been fortunate in this state, based on leadership, to have relatively low levels, to have public health protected. So, if I thought L.D. 985 would create jobs or if I thought L.D. 985 would open businesses, I might have a different viewpoint. But L.D. 985 is really just to hamstring the current Governor. There has not been a single specific action that she's taken that I have heard that should not have been taken and I'm happy to hear that, having to listen to that, and we have plenty of opportunity in committee to listen to that, but the fact is this bill, first of all, would not serve the public health, would not open any businesses, would not save any jobs. This Chief Executive, this Legislature, is funneling hundreds of millions of dollars in tax cuts and in direct recovery grants to small businesses all across this state, but there was a pandemic that was worldwide. Our Chief Executive handled it, she did not cause the pandemic, and she certainly did not cause businesses to close. She acted responsibly and safely and, in fact, we are in better shape now for economic recovery than probably most of the states in this country. Thank you very much, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Sanborn.

Senator **SANBORN:** Thank you, Mr. President. I rise only briefly to remind my colleagues in the Senate that as soon as the CDC determined that there was a safe path for us to get back together and take votes as a Legislature we tried twice to do so, to bring ourselves back in so that we would have a voice in how the emergency powers were handled last summer and both times we were not able to get support from the other side of the aisle to call ourselves back in so that our legislative voice could be heard. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Daughtry.

Senator **DAUGHTRY:** Thank you, Mr. President. I rise, I just wanted to speak a little bit to the comments made by the good Senator from Aroostook County who did read a list of businesses that have closed. It's unfortunate whenever a business closes. Some of the ones that he mentioned not only are in my district or other colleagues, but I do have to say what we say goes on the record in this Chamber and, for history and posterity, I do want to rise up to say that some of those businesses actually didn't close. They just moved locations and some actually that were read off went onto better locations. I have to say, I ate at Po' Boys and Pickles not that long ago and it is definitely still open and fabulous. So, I just wanted to make sure that that was on the record. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Guerin.

Senator **GUERIN:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, the list read by my good colleague, Senator Stewart, was very personal to me. Many of them were my customers that came through my door of my restaurant supply company begging me to help them and repeatedly I had to say

that my voice had been silenced, along with the colleagues in this room and our colleagues in the House, and that I really had no way, no recourse, to save them and I definitely would have come back into session to deal with the COVID related bills but we did not want the scope to go beyond that and that was the reason I didn't vote to come back in, because the insistence that we would deal with things not COVID related when we were being told that it wasn't safe to be out and congregating. It seemed that the idea of keeping the Legislature in session to deal with anything more than COVID was irresponsible. But when I think back to that list, many people had indeavored to start a second business, I think Po' Boys and Pickles would be an example of that, one of my sons used to work there, and had to close down locations to go to just one location. But many of my dear friends, I think of Nicky's Cruisin Diner. He probably came to my business ten times and said, 'I am going to lose my business. This is my retirement. I have worked here,' I think it was 38 years and his business was his retirement and he lost his business because of the decisions made by the Chief Executive and we were not allowed to have a say in that, and I was elected to represent people like Nicky's Cruisin Diner and to be their voice. Even if I was voted down, they would have had a voice in what was going on and really changing the course of their life. He lost his business at 68 years old. There's no time to regroup and start another business. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Somerset, Senator Farrin.

Senator **FARRIN:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I listen to this back and forth and thinking about what happened this summer and whether this was looking to the future of things we might have with the Chief Executive or how this Chief Executive performed. I just want to throw something out there. As we gather on this bill, and I think we'll probably see some others that address some of these same things, and as we come together after Memorial Day and we're spending a few days together, I want you to all please think of one thing that has been on my mind a lot the last few days, and this is not my numbers, this is from the Maine CDC. This is from our Chief Executive and her Commissioner and Director of the CDC. Of those deaths that we talk about here, COVID related, in the state of Maine, 55% to 60% have happened in our long-term care facilities and our nursing homes. Those are facts from our CDC and out of the \$1.25 billion that was allocated from the Federal Cares Act and from the \$1.1 billion in the Federal Recovery Act, again numbers from our Chief Executive, less than 2% has gone to those facilities. That's why we need a seat at the table and that's why we should be having those conversations to direct that. Those are our family members, our neighbors, our loved ones, and those direct care workers and the people in those facilities. So, I hope we all keep that in mind as we go forward between now and June 16th. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Timberlake.

Senator **TIMBERLAKE:** Did I push the button right this time? Did I get it right? Alright. Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I think one of the reasons I want to see this bill go forward is my constituents. The fact of the matter is, ladies and gentlemen, by the time this bill gets out and would

become law I hope and I pray to God that this pandemic is over and the next time we'd deal with it is under a different situation. I'm not here to say whether that I think everything that this Governor did or didn't do was bad or good. Some of it I'll agree with, some of it I'll disagree with. That's the way we all are and I think, in my opinion. This is about what happens in the future and I said a long time ago that we're a separate branch of government and we deserve a seat at the table and to be part of the answer. We may have agreed every time that it was our turn to make a decision. We may have agreed to extend her powers and let this Governor do exactly what she did, but we'll never know because we never got a chance to be asked that question. All I ask is that, into the future, that maybe the next Governor, because hopefully we don't have - this Governor doesn't have to deal with another pandemic, but maybe the next Governor will come from our side of the aisle and you folks would want a seat at the table too, and I know I would want a seat at the table even if it was from my side of the aisle. I don't care who it is. We're a Legislative Body, we're supposed to oversee that. We're supposed to oversee the money. I think it's important. It was important enough for us to put it into the spending bill that we passed as an Emergency Measure to make it so that she couldn't spend any of the ARP money without having at least 50% approval from the Legislature. It was important enough for us to do that. I think it's important enough for us right now to pass a bill that, into the future, the Governor of the State of Maine, if they go more than 60 days, has to come back to the Legislature and plead their case. I encourage you to vote down the pending motion and vote in support of L.D. 985. Thank you all very much.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Lawrence.

Senator **LAWRENCE:** Thank you, Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I appreciate the statistics given to us by the good Senator from Somerset and I think there are other important statistics to consider. Had we not had this emergency situation, had we not had these Executive powers, there would be 2,000 to 4,000 more Mainers dead right now. They would not be in nursing homes. They would be our children, people in our workforce who would have died from this COVID. The fact is, this bill will not do one thing to stop this pandemic. If you want to stop this pandemic, you should get on your soap box, encourage your constituents to get vaccinated, wear their masks. If by July 4th we can vaccinate another 320,000 Mainers, approximately 7,000 a day, we can hit that 75% mark by July 4th. In my district, my businesses are depending upon you, not to pass this bill but to get out there and get your constituents into the vaccination program. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Hickman.

Senator **HICKMAN:** Thank you, Mr. President. I just want to make sure that I have the Constitution in front of me so I can not speak incorrectly. So, this bill is a Resolution to amend the Constitution under Article IV, Part 3rd, which is entitled 'Legislative Powers' and it would insert a new Section 24 which, more or less, says that if a State of Emergency goes past 60 days the Legislature would have to approve it. If we put that in the Constitution, the Legislature already has the power to put that in the Statutes, which might be a better place to consider this, but if

we actually put that in the Constitution, and there's a State of Emergency in the future, would the Legislature cannot convene 60 days after the State of Emergency? We're creating a Constitutional crisis. Vote the bill down.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Daughtry.

Senator **DAUGHTRY:** Thank you, Mr. President. I have to echo many of the comments made by my good colleague who just spoke before me and also before him. I just want to state, I think about we never know what's coming around the corner. None of us, five years ago when we were sitting around, could have known what we would be facing now. None of us could have thought that we'd be making sure we had the correct social distancing or worrying when you step outside the car whether or not you have a mask or if you have enough hand sanitizer. It's hard to legislate for the future without considering the past, but we also can't hamstring our future, and we don't know what a future emergency might look like, and I do have deep concerns about putting ourselves in a Constitutional crisis if we have the type of natural disaster or emergency that actually, physically, keeps us from being present. But I also want to talk a little bit, you know I've heard comments about we would have come in if it was to deal with COVID matters and what would it be like if it was under a different Administration. I want to remind folks, I'm going to take a little bit of time down history lane, we have, under different Chief Executives, voted to come back in. We've done this under the current Chief Executive and one other prior Administration as well, and I think, you know, I want to echo the good comments from the Senator from York County. It's incumbent on us to do more than this. This isn't how we're going to keep businesses from closing. This isn't how we're going to get out of this pandemic. We're here to make sure that we're having robust response to support our schools, our businesses, our communities, and get us one step closer to that day where we can strip these masks off, have herd immunity, have the safety, and a robust economic recovery that I know we all agree on. So, I think we need to vote this down and focus on what really matters for Maine.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is Acceptance of the Majority Ought Not to Pass Report. Is the Senate ready for the question?

**JOINT RESOLUTION
RECOGNIZING AUGUST 31, 2021 AS
OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY IN MAINE**

WHEREAS, substance use disorder is a chronic disease characterized by the problematic, compulsive or difficult-to-control use of drugs and other substances, despite harmful consequences; and

WHEREAS, substance use disorder, particularly when it involves opioid drugs, is seen by both the federal Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the World Health Organization as a fast-growing epidemic that can all too easily lead to overdose and death; and

WHEREAS, there were 70,980 individuals in the United States who died from drug overdoses in 2019, with 380 of those deaths in Maine; and

WHEREAS, a life cut short by an opioid overdose death is devastating for the family and loved ones left behind and is a tragic reminder of the significant and complex challenges we face in communities throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, for every drug overdose that results in death, there are many more nonfatal overdoses, each taking an emotional and economic toll on individuals, their families and the community at large; and

WHEREAS, a substance use disorder can fuel feelings of shame, guilt, embarrassment, depression and hopelessness, causing individuals to resist seeking treatment and support; and

WHEREAS, Overdose Awareness Day is a global event held on August 31st of each year that aims to raise awareness of drug overdoses, reduce the stigma of a drug-related death and acknowledge the grief felt by families and friends remembering those who died or were permanently injured as a result of a drug overdose; and

WHEREAS, recognizing Overdose Awareness Day in Maine sends a strong message to former and current substance users, namely, that they are valued and that overdose death is preventable; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Thirtieth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to recognize August 31, 2021 as Overdose Awareness Day; and be it further

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Off Record Remarks

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Cyrway.

Senator **CYRWAY:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I'd just like to take just a few minutes about some officers that really impacted me in my life that we lost. These officers are real people, just like you and I. Trooper Jeff Parola, I worked with him and we had coffee just a few nights before his tragic accident on top at the Big Apple in Gardiner here and we used to meet quite often up there, about 1 o'clock in the morning, if everything was quiet and we'd have coffees with several officers and we'd talk about, you know, just our families and kind of a stress reliever, you know, and once in a while we'd learn about each other, about different things that was happening. That was a great man and he loved his family. Also, Trooper

Tom Merry, he was a classmate of mine, close friend, and we'd visit each other at our homes and do things together, and left a big impact. He's buried just two miles down from the house that I live at. Corp. Cole, Eugene Cole, I worked with him at a few accidents and cases. We were on the border, you know, between Kennebec and Somerset and I worked with him several times. Great gentleman and I'd see him every year over at the Skowhegan Fair. He loved to work that, and a great man. Nick Desjardins, he was one of my DARE students and his mother worked on my father's farm. So, very close to them. One time I was just behind the U.S. Capitol in the 1990s with the Explorer Post. I was one of the mentors for the Explorer Post Conference. We was at Maryland University and we stayed right behind the Capitol and we was just on the other side of the Capitol when two police officers, Capitol Police, were shot right on the steps. It was very tragic. So I've seen pain from families and friends and I just want to say God bless all the brave men and women that serve and protect all of us. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair would call the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Davis, to the Rostrum.

Senator **DAVIS:** Good afternoon, colleagues. In 1962, President John F. Kennedy designated May 15th as National Police Day and he also designated the week of May 15th as National Police Week. In 1991, the Maine Chiefs of Police Association raised money and created a memorial, which is out on our campus down here in Augusta, at the Capital. Every year since then there has been a ceremony honoring police officers that are listed on there, there is 88 of them, with the exception of this year. As you all know, we were here in the Capital this year - we were not in the Capital this year because of the COVID and it troubled me a bit that we weren't honoring those that had died in the line of duty. So, President Jackson was very gracious yesterday. Told me that we could do this, we would have the reading of the names, and I can't tell you, Mr. President, how much I appreciate this. Thank you very, very much. I will read the names.
