Senator **RAYE**: Thank you, Madame President. I rise this morning with a heavy heart. I will speak in a few days more on this, but I wanted to just share for the record and with my colleagues in the Senate that we've suffered a very terrible loss, particularly those of us who serve on the Health and Human Services Committee, with the sudden and tragic passing of Pam Morrill, our clerk, who, while visiting her elderly parents whom she gave a great deal of love, attention and care on Sunday evening, was stricken with a fatal heart attack and passed away. It is a tragedy for her family; for her wonderful daughter, Sarah; for her elderly parents who loved and depended on her so much in their declining years; and for all of us who had the pleasure to know Pam over the years. She served in this building, working in Governor McKernan's office during his administration. She worked with the late Abby Holman, who was her closest friend and whose death was a terrible blow to Pam. They worked together at the Maine Forest Products Council. She has been, for the last year and some odd months, an absolutely phenomenal clerk who has been able to meet the challenge of an extremely busy committee and keep us all on task. I was always amazed at her organization and her positive outlook, no matter how stressful or how busy we were. It's a terrible loss and those of us on the committee and those of us who have been her friends over the years are, I think fair to say, in a state of shock at the moment. I wanted to make sure everybody knew of Pam's passing and that our thoughts and prayers be with her family and that when we adjourn today that we do so in honor and tribute to Pam Morrill.

Senator **NUTTING** of Androscoggin was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record.

Senator **NUTTING**: Thank you, Madame President. I also wanted to just say a brief word. I've known Pam for years. It was a real shock. The lesson here, to me anyways, is that the last week she hadn't been feeling quite well. She had a lot of heartburn the last week and had been, like I've done and most of us have done, taking a lot of Tums and other stuff for it. There was really a sign there that she didn't recognize. That's just so unfortunate. To me, she had energy enough for two people and always was that way. I knew her when she used to clerk the State and Local Government Committee and the Education Committee and worked with the Forest Products Council. I've known her for years and years. It's just so much of a shock. Those little telltale signs, I think, were there. It's just so sad that

she didn't recognize them and that others didn't recognize them. Thank you.

Senator **TURNER** of Cumberland was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record.

Senator **TURNER**: Thank you, Madame President. Life oftentimes is too short and Pam Morrill is certainly a case where it is way too short. I'd like to close the session on a more upbeat note. Next month will be my Aunt Laura's 99th birthday. There is a sentiment for her on the calendar that I did not speak on earlier but I do want to share a few things from that sentiment with you because they are great things to live by. She was always, and continues to this day, to have a strong hand in my immediate family and my extended family. Her advice is rather straightforward but I think very salient to all of us. Be anything you want to be in life. Always be kind to those less fortunate. Always try to offer a helping hand to those who are in need. Remember that health, happiness, and family are all that counts. Stand up for what you believe in. Of course she would say those embody Republican values and she came from a mixed family where political discussion was hot and heavy. Her sister and brother-in-law were Democrats and we had great discussions around the dinner table, the lunch table, and the breakfast table. I wish my Aunt Laura the very best on her 99th. I hope I can live half as long as she has in the remaining time that I have. Thank you, Madame President.

Senator **RAYE**: Thank you, Madame President. At the risk of exposing a fact that I have tried very hard to hide during my years in Augusta, Senator Turner and I are sort of related. I just had to take a moment to rise and join him in paying tribute to Aunt Laura. I had the pleasure as a little boy of living next door to Laura and her husband, Uncle Lester. While they were not blood relatives to me, I didn't know that until I was fairly well grown up because they were literally family. She is a remarkable person. If you met her you would be just blown away by the energy and the dynamism that she still radiates at the age of 99. She stands, I would guess, about 4' 8" and probably 85 or 90 pounds. She is just full of energy and lives life to the fullest. She inspires everybody who knows her. It gives me enormous pleasure to be able to associate myself with Senator Turner's tribute to Laura MacLean Turner. Thank you.
