WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret of the death of:

(1-16) the Honorable Richard W. Redmond, of Augusta. Mr. Redmond served four years in the United States Navy, including one year of service on the world-famous USS *Missouri*. An athlete, he fought in the 1948 Golden Gloves Tournament, winning the welterweight title, and was a professional fighter for two years. In 2000, he published *Maine Boxing Record Book, 1922-2000*. Mr. Redmond became a teacher and coach at the high school and college levels before joining the State's Department of Education in 1964. He served as Deputy Commissioner for the department for several years and was appointed Commissioner by Governor Joseph Brennan in 1986. Mr. Redmond will be long remembered and sadly missed by his wife of over 64 years, Evelyn, and by his family and friends;
